A new, comprehensive online resource for all aspects of mediation — built by mediators for mediators.

Mediation.org, a division of the American Arbitration Association®, provides support for individuals and companies seeking mediators to resolve disputes; services include mediation case management and online dispute resolution. Practicing mediators can publish their resumes in the searchable online mediator database alongside AAA® panel mediators and receive practice tips and tools, professional development resources, and education and training opportunities.

How can I find a mediator from the site?

Profiles of Mediation.org's extensive list of mediators with expertise in business, construction, finance, healthcare, insurance, family, eldercare, and other diverse fields help you to identify and select a mediator best suited for a particular dispute.

Can I file online through Mediation.org?

Mediation.org provides online mediation — no telephone or face-to-face sessions — for disputes in which there are only two parties and neither the claim nor the counterclaim is valued at greater than \$10,000. The \$200 flat fee includes mediation case management as well as the mediator's fee.

What resources are available to mediators?

Mediation.org is a community of colleagues for mediators — their club, their library, their forum. On Mediation.org, mediators can:

- make their resumes available for selection by parties.
- get access to "tools of the trade" (rules, standards of conduct, statutes by state).
- find trade and academic organizations for continuing education and/or membership.
- publish their original articles.

What other mediation services are available to the general public?

You will find information on mass claims mediation, residential mortgage mediation in Florida, and Judicial Settlement Conference, which mirrors the process of settlement conferences sponsored by courts and utilizes neutrals selected from a panel of former judges with especially strong settlement skills.
